Quality Early Learning Programs

Stage 1 Child Care: The California Work Opportunity and Responsibility to Kids (CalWORKs) Child Care known as Stage 1 is a supportive service for adults who are receiving CalWORKs benefits. The California Department of Social Services (CDSS) provides funding for child care supportive services for those parents who are approved for CalWORKs, required to participate in Welfare-to-Work and have at least one child under 13 years of age. Child Care services are also available to eligible families who have transitioned off the CalWORKs program.

Stage 2 Child Care: CalWORKs Child Care Stage 2 is a service for parents who are transitioning off CalWORKs benefits or have transitioned off within 24 months. The California Department of Social Services (CDSS) provides funding for child care supportive services for those parents who meet eligibility, have a documented need for child care services and have at least one child under 13 years of age.

Resource Parents for Foster Youth

Resource Family Approval (RFA)is a family-friendly and child-centered caregiver approval process that replaced the previous foster parent-licensing program, and includes approvals for foster parent, adoption and legal guardianship.

The Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) Youth Program delivers comprehensive youth services that focus on assisting eligible out-of-school youth and in-school youth, with one or more barriers to employment, to prepare for employment and postsecondary education opportunities; attain educational and/or skills training credentials; and secure employment with career/promotional opportunities. The Contra Costa County Workforce Development Board is hosting two free all-day Youth Summits - June 27 at Centre Concord in Concord, and June 28 at Marina Community Center in Pittsburg - featuring motivational speaker Arel Moodie, raffles, prizes, food, and fun.

Community Oral Health Program

The Community Oral Health Program works in collaboration with schools and community partners to increase access to oral health services by linking children, youth and families to no or low-cost dental resources. This program includes both the Children's Oral Health Program and the Local Oral Health Program , which includes the Local Community Health Improvement Plan. The Children's Oral Health Program began its efforts to improve the health of Contra Costa County children and youth in 1977. More recently, the program expanded its role to include understanding, assessing and working collaboratively with community partners to impact Contra Costa County's oral health system – developing a comprehensive community health improvement plan. Black Infant Health Program

Anti-Black Racism, as well as social and economic stressors, play a major role in poor birth outcomes—babies born too early and too small—for Black women. Within a culturally supportive environment, and honoring the unique history of Black women, California Black Infant Health (BIH) aims to help women have healthy babies. BIH implements an evidence-informed intervention that uses a group-based approach, where participants get to meet, interact and build a sisterhood with other Black women. Group sessions are complemented with client-centered life planning, goal setting and referrals to services. This powerful combination serves to help women enhance life skills, learn proven strategies to reduce stress and build social support. Ultimately, this two-pronged approach impacts not only participants themselves, but future generations of Black women, infants and families.

Perinatal Equity Initiative & Deliver Birth Justice Campaign

Statewide the mortality rate for Black infants continues to be two to four times higher than rates for other groups. Due to these disparities, the state created the California Perinatal Equity Initiative (PEI) within the Department of Public Health in 2018.PEI aims to address the causes of persistent inequality and promote specific interventions designed to improve outcomes for Black mothers and their families. The PEI complements programs and services offered through the Black Infant Health (BIH) Group Model, which provides services, information and social support to Black mothers to buffer the negative effects of racism and its consequences on women.. Contra Costa's PEI direct service interventions are community-based doula and fatherhood support programs. Our collaborative and systems interventions are a community advisory board and a public awareness campaign called *Deliver Birth Justice*.
