

Why Contra Costa County?

•Cost of Living

- Minimum Income to afford basic needs:
 - Single Adult: \$46,064
 - Single Adult, 1 preschooler: \$95,161
 - 2 Adults, 1 school age child, 1 preschooler: \$126,616

Purpose

- To spread educational awareness about the power and potential of Guaranteed Income.
- Plant the seeds of a growing social movement in support of Guaranteed Income in Contra Costa County.
- Ensure community voices and needs are at the center of our research.
- Work towards securing a county-wide initiative.



Research Methodology

Community Outreach

- 3 County-Wide Community Events
 - Virtual community listening sessions
 - GI Education & World Café Style discussions
 - \$50 stipends for participant community members



• 9 Focus Groups

- Smaller & more personalized than the community events
- Ensured that underrepresented communities were present in the conversation
- \$75 stipends for participant community members

In total, **353 community members** participated in the community-wide events and focus groups.

Research Methodology

Community Outreach

- Financial Wellness Survey
 - A survey monkey to gauge financial wellness across
 Contra Costa County
 - In total, 173 community members, filled out our survey
- Guaranteed Income Education Sessions
 - In collaboration with local coalition groups; Multi-Faith Action Coalition, Historically Marginalized Communities Engagement, Mobility Labs Community Group



Initial Topline Insights



"Financial stability means everything. It can dictate the level of freedom, happiness, and stress myself and family feel every single day." - Survey participant

"[GI] will give me the freedom to spend time with my mother and grandchildren and have my bills paid in a timely manner without having to think about where I have to cut corners to keep my finances afloat." – Survey participant

"I learned that we can relate when it comes to social economics no matter where you live in Contra Costa County" – Community participant

Mobility Labs GI Pilot	 Comment Studio GI Pilot 2023-2024 GI for 20 adults, 10 youth, in Antioch, CA Private funding
Board of Supervisors	 Board unanimously passed benefits waiver request for residents who participate in a GI pilot Continued interest in learning for about GI
